My interest in the Educator Fellow position is motivated by a desire to better bridge Chicago's rich science research culture with science education in the public schools. It's all too common that students fail to make connections

between 'school science' and 'real science,' but national models for science education increasingly emphasize the need to merge the two, from the early grades through high school. The 'STEM' and 'maker' movements encourage the integration of math, engineering, and technology into science education precisely because this kind of integration better reflects the kind of authentic problems that motivate students. C2ST provides all teachers and their students in Chicago Public Schools (and in schools from throughout the region and the world) access to experiences that take them into the world of working scientists, engineers, and mathematicians. These experiences are the best way to encourage the next generation, and my mission as the C2ST Educator Fellow is to make them as accessible as possible for teachers and students.




